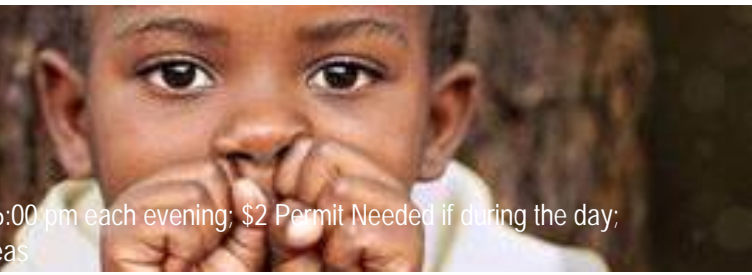

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There are currently over 27 million human trafficking victims worldwide, with the average age of entry just 12 years-old. Child trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation is the fastest growing and second largest criminal industry in the world today. Each year an estimated 5.5 million children are exploited in prostitution or pornography (US fund for UNICEF's End Trafficking). Human rights investigations share that minors are sold on average 10 to 15 times a day, 6 days a week, totaling between 9,360 and 14,040 sex acts a year. Join us to learn the impact this trauma has on a developing youth's brain and the long-term healing needed to overcome the loss of childhood and a sense of self.

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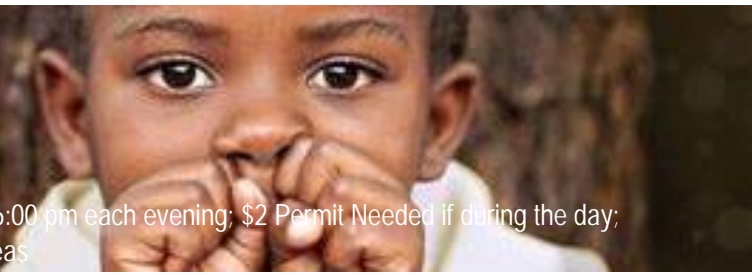
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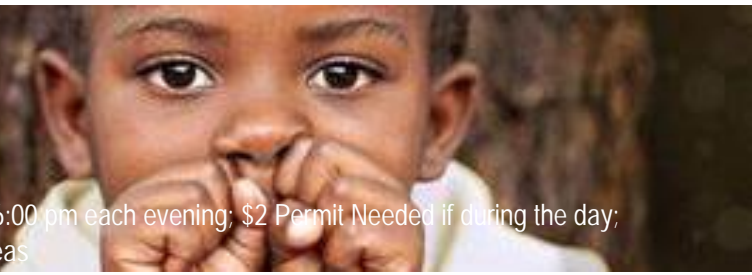
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
